### Apiary update – Eric Sortwell

It's just a year ago we were looking for a new apiary site; we explored many possibilities and finally decided on our site at Langford. A lot has happened this year. We started to move in the Autumn of last year and the new site was finished by May of this year, ready for this year's new beekeepers.



And then COVID 19 struck and all training was postponed; it was a real disappointment that we were unable to welcome our new trainee beekeepers to the club's new apiary.

Throughout the summer, the club hives have been looked after by a small but dedicated team of experienced beekeepers, and other club members

assisting with grass cutting and general maintenance jobs.



The season is now coming to an end, all the hives have been treated with Apiguard and checked to ensure they have sufficient stores to take them through the winter; and topping up if needed.

In December we are considering treatment for Varroa using the Gas-Vap oxalic acid method that we tried last year, and which appeared to be very effective.

I am pleased to say we are going into winter with ten strong colonies of bees ready for next year when hopefully we shall be able to start our training sessions again.



We were able to invite small groups of members to the apiary to look at the facilities we have to offer and, of course, a chance to chat about bees.

Looking forward to inviting all members of the club to the apiary next year and a successful year of beekeeping. Just keep on Buzzing as our bees do.
