### General Data Protection Regulations – Stan Wroe

We have all been inundated with emails from companies about their compliance with the new GDPR which came into force in May. These affect charities too and the committee has been seeking guidance from the BBKA on steps we need to take to ensure compliance.

The BBKA is trialing a system with some local associations which will meet all the GDPR requirements, will allow electronic completion of forms, have built in email for secretaries and will in due course enable payment via Paypal. There is an Autumn deadline for implementation.

North Somerset Beekeepers has asked members for consent to share limited contact details with fellow members. We have reviewed processes to ensure data are stored in compliance with the regulations.

### Bees in School - Garry Packer

I recently went into a Bristol primary school to run a series of activities around insect pollinators. I explained how pollinators are important for farming and the UK economy significantly improving crop yields. Then gave a short talk and showed (Rob's) video about bees (did you know there are about 270 different species of bee in the UK). We also had some honey tasting, candle making, dressing up in a bee suit, looked in an empty hive and then at some live bees in a display hive.
